Theme

Our theme takes us across the Atlantic to Central and South America. Much of the children's learning will have a focus on life in and around the Amazon Rainforest.

In **English**, our writing will take inspiration from the book '*Journey to the River Sed*', including:

- Writing an informal letter and a persuasive, formal letter
- Laying out speech
- · Performing and writing rainforest poetry
- Descriptive writing, including stories from different perspectives.
- Documentary script writing

In Geography, we will focus on:

- latitude/longitude/tropics, equator and zones (including time zones);
- using maps/atlases to locate countries /cities of South America;
- · comparing UK and South America;
- physical geography of Brazil and the Amazon rainforests;
- climate zones, biomes and vegetation belts;
- deforestation, reforestation, bioeconomy and sustainable products

Geography Fieldwork will involve us going out into the town centre, exploring the question 'What impact does colour have on our experiences of our local environment?'

In Art, we will be creating a collaborative rainforest-inspired sculpture created using wire.

In **Science**, our 'Living things and their habitats' unit links with our theme this term. We will:

- Describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird.
- Describe the life process of reproduction in plants (flowering and non-flowering) and animals.

Maths

In Maths, we will be focusing on:

- adding and subtracting fractions, including mixed numbers;
- multiplying and dividing using the formal methods of calculation
- · multiplying fractions
- decimals, including equivalent fractions and decimals, and comparing and ordering fractions
- percentages
- perimeter
- area

Computing and DT

We will be further developing their programming skills with block coding using Scratch. Then the children will be developing their video production skills.
