

DT

In terms 5 and 6, the children will be designing and creating their own picture book with moving images. Their target audience will be Year 1 and we will share the books with Ash and Elm class. The children will evaluate current children's picture books and explore different levers and linkages, before planning and designing their own picture book.

Art

The children will explore textural art using various paper skills, such as ripping, curling, quilling and twisting. The children will apply these skills to create a three-dimensional scene from a well-known book.

Music

The children will continue to receive their ukulele tuition for the remainder of the year.

In term 5, the children will be studying a piece of music called 'Take the A Train' by Billy Strayhorn. They will analyse the piece and work in groups to compose their own piece inspired by the same artist.

In term 6, the children will explore the Pink Panther film theme tune and create their own sound effects and accompanying music.
