 Measurement – Time - We will continue to learn about time and tell and draw the time to the hour and half past the hour.

- Measurement Length Comparing, describing, ordering and measuring lengths and heights using nonstandard and standard measures.
- Multiplication Division Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Link 2s to doubling and halving. Practical grouping and sharing.
- Fractions Finding halves and quarters of objects, numbers, shapes and quantities. Practically solve word problems.
- Place value Revision of partitioning using tens and ones up to 100.
- Money Recognising coins and notes to their value.
- Measurement Weight and Capacity Describe, compare, order, estimate and measure. Solve practical problems.
- **Positional direction** Describe turns using positions, left, right, above and below.
- Numbers to 100- Counting forward and back within 100, one more one less and compare numbers.

Home Learning: We recommend having short blasts on Numbots weekly which supports the Maths learning that has recently taken place in school.

PE

The children will continue to develop their gross motor skills and coordination in PE via multi-skills such as throwing, catching, jumping and moving in different ways; in preparation for Sports Day. The focus for Indoor PE is gymnastics. PE is on a Monday and Tuesday(Ash). Tuesday and Wednesday (Elm).

Science

We will be planting seeds, observing how they grow and describing the structure of flowering plants and trees. We will also become familiar with names of common plants including deciduous and evergreen trees. The children will be learning about a variety of common animals by describing and comparing them. In addition to this, they will be learning about the human body.

Home Learning: Observe and discuss seasonal change, ask and answer questions about plants and animals in their habitat. Observe the growth of flowers and vegetables.
