

Curriculum

In **Geography**, the children will learn about rivers and coastal features, carrying out fieldwork. They will explore different types of settlements and compare urban and rural landscapes. The children will use sources such as maps and atlases to answer questions about the UK.

In **English**, the children will develop their language, debating, drama, creative and non-fiction writing skills through a variety of stories. We will continue to focus on using a range of punctuation accurately: full stops, commas in lists, question marks, exclamation marks and the use of inverted commas for speech.

In **Science**, the children will be learning about animals, including humans (nutrition, skeletons, muscles) and rocks.

In **Art**, the children will learn how to manipulate materials in order to create a collage of a river and the surrounding landscape.

In **Computing**, the children will develop their understanding of what a branching database is and how to create one. They will gain an understanding of what attributes are and how to use them to sort groups of objects by using yes/no questions.
