Theme

Our theme this term is the Second World War. During this topic, the children will be encouraged to think critically about historical artefacts and sources of evidence, and explore key events between 1939 and 1945.

History:

- Famous battles
- World War II leaders
- Life as an evacuee
- Life on the Home Front

English:

- Diary entries and letters as an evacuee
- Performing war poetry
- Biography based on a WW2 leader
- Story set in WW2
- Reading comprehension based on the picture book 'Rose Blanche'

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In Computing, pupils will focus on filming and editing techniques as part of their documentary project as well as using spreadsheets to study statistics about the war.

In **Art**, the discover project will explore emotion, with the children creating a powerful portrait of a soldier. Children will also be using watercolours to depict scenes from Operation Dynamo and creating a 3D Spitfire plane.

In **Geography**, pupils will use map skills to locate countries involved in the war.
