Marshall is a 6 year old cockapoo, who is a hypoallergenic breed. He has undergone a thorough assessment to ensure that he is suitable as a Pets As Therapy dog. This included walking nicely, not jumping up and taking treats gently. He had to 'pass' all of the tasks in order to be accepted as a Pets As Therapy dog. Marshall has already been practising his skills at the Hospice in the Weald!

We have space for a small number of pupils to participate but feel it will be incredibly beneficial to them. We have thought about our selection really carefully and will be in touch if your child has been chosen to spend some time with Marshall.
