

Theme

Our theme this term is ancient Greece. During this topic, the children will be encouraged to think critically about historical artefacts and sources of evidence, learn about the way people lived in the ancient Greek civilisation, and make links between modern life and the ancient world.

History

- Place the ancient Greek civilisation on a timeline.
- Study the myths, beliefs, and lifestyles of the era (including democracy, the Olympics, and the theatre).
- Compare and contrast life in ancient Greece with modern life.

English

- Our Power of Reading text will be *The Adventures of Odysseus*.
- Through this text, the children will be writing in a variety of genres, including a letter, a diary, a newspaper, an extended journey narrative and a non-fiction text.
- Following on from Year 4, the children will be strengthening their use of expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials, speech punctuation and presentation, adventurous verbs and figurative language.
- We will be introducing relative clauses and personification to use in our independent writing.
- Our Discover Project will be to create a museum exhibit around pottery.

Art

- Sketching with a focus on tone, shade and lighting.
- Create an ancient Greek-inspired coil pot using clay, with a focus on joining, using the score and slip technique.

Computing

- Creating media - Video production: pupils will learn how to shoot and edit short videos.
- Systems and Searching: pupils will develop their understanding of computer systems, how information is transferred between systems and devices, how the internet facilitates online communication and collaboration.

- Number and place value up to 1,000,000
- Addition and subtraction.
- Multiplication and division.
- Fractions (inc. converting, equivalence, adding and subtracting)
- Multiplication Tables and Division Facts.

Science

- In our ‘Forces’ topic, pupils will learn about, and undertake investigations relating to, gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction.
- As part of ‘Space and the Earth’, the children will be taught to about the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun and the moon, relative to Earth, and the Sun across the sky.

PE

- Outdoor PE will be Basketball in Term 1 and Football in Term 2
- Year 5 will be swimming up until Christmas
