

What was life like...?

English:

- Diary entries and letters as an evacuee
- Performing war poetry
- Biography based on a WW2 leader
- Story set in WW2
- Reading comprehension based on the picture book 'Rose Blanche'

In **History**, the children will delve into key events between 1939 and 1945:

- Famous battles
- Second World War leaders
- Life as an evacuee
- Life on the Home Front

In **Computing**, pupils will focus on filming and editing techniques as part of their documentary project as well as using spreadsheets to study statistics about the war.

In **Art**, the discover project will explore emotion, with the children creating a powerful portrait of a soldier. Children will also be using watercolours to depict scenes from Operation Dynamo and creating a 3D Spitfire plane.

In **DT**, the children will design and make food using rationed foods. The pupils will plan, make and evaluate a gingerbread house – as is tradition.

In **Geography**, pupils will use map skills to locate countries involved in the war.
