

How is maths used in the real world?

- reading a map
- constructing something with specific measurements
- recording the weather
- measuring how far apart to sow seeds

All the schools who attended performed incredible routines and the judges (professional cheerleaders who have attended world championships in the sport) were blown away. The top 5 teams were split by 0.5 points each.
